


## **HARVEST REGULATIONS**

- 1. Thinning and Red Pine Row Thinning: Harvest all trees marked with orange paint. Do Not Cut any unmarked Red Pine or White Pine. Leave all dead trees standing unless they create a hazard during forest operations. Do Not Cut any Oak. Do not damage any fire scar snags/stumps. Do not enter bog areas in or around harvest area. Do not enter regenerating stands surrounding the harvest area. Pull harvested trees out of wetlands before being limbed and topped.**
- 2. \*\*Harvesting is restricted to the period between August 1<sup>st</sup> and February 29<sup>th</sup> in Harvest Blocks A and C. Harvesting is restricted to the period between November 1<sup>st</sup> and March 14<sup>th</sup> in Harvest Block B.**
- 3. \*\*Harvest Block A must be completed last due to the presence of invasive species. All harvesting and skidding must be completed on the current harvest block prior to moving operations to the next harvest block.**
- 4. During the period from May 15 through August 15, the contractor must remove all cut pine products from the sale area within 14 days of cutting.**
- 5. Avoid damage to residual trees. This reduces the risk of spreading disease and degrading future crop trees. Excessive rutting and/or excessive damage to residual trees will cause temporary closure of harvesting operations.**
- 6. Tree and pole length skidding will be allowed if the contractor demonstrates the ability to skid without damaging residual trees. If excessive damages occurs penalties will apply and skidding will be limited to shortwood skidding.**
- 7. All trees felled across the Blue Paint Line property boundary must be pulled back into the sale area before being limbed and topped.**
- 8. Existing trails serve this area sufficiently therefore, Vilas County prohibits the construction of new roads. All roads and landings must be cleared and leveled upon sale completion. Hunter Hiking Trails must be left in an equal or better condition that is conducive for mowing post-harvest.**
- 9. A state funded snowmobile trail uses Heart Lake Road. During the snow season, the contractor must keep snowmobile trails free of logging debris and equipment. When plowing during this time the contractor must leave snow on the trail at all times.**
- 10. The Rummels road bridge to Highway 45 has a maximum capacity of 15 Tons.**
- 11. Refer to the Timber Sale Contract for all harvest regulations.**
