

Harvest Regulations:

1. **Sale Area:** Harvest all merchantable and non-merchantable trees with a diameter greater than 1 inch. Leave all dead trees standing unless they create a hazard during operations.
2. No entrance or harvest of trees from Green Tree Retention and RMZ or Wetland areas. Trees felled into these areas must be pulled back into the harvest area before limbing. Vilas County Forestry staff will designate an access point for the harvest block north of the large wetland. Use and removal of slash mats by contractor will be mandatory.
3. Harvesting is restricted to the period of September 1st to February 28th on extremely dry or frozen conditions.
4. Avoid damage to residual trees. This reduces the risk of spreading disease and degrading future crop trees. Excessive rutting and/or excessive damage to residual trees will cause temporary closure of harvesting operations. Do not damage relic fire scar stumps/trees.
5. Tree and pole length skidding will be allowed if the contractor demonstrates the ability to skid without damaging residual trees. If excessive damages occurs penalties will apply and skidding will be limited to shortwood skidding.
6. All trees felled across the Blue Paint Lines must be pulled back into the sale area before being limbed and topped.
7. A state funded snowmobile trail uses the timber access trail to the south and east. During the snow season, the contractor must keep snowmobile trails free of logging debris and equipment. When plowing during this time the contractor must leave snow on the trail at all times.
8. Existing trails serve this area sufficiently therefore, Vilas County prohibits the construction of new roads. All roads and landings must be cleared and leveled upon sale completion. Hunter Hiking Trails must be left in an equal or better condition that is conducive for mowing post-harvest.
9. Refer to the Timber Sale Contract for all harvest regulations.
