

*****HARVEST REGULATIONS ON REVERSE SIDE*****

Harvest Regulations

1. **ASPEN COPPICE AREA:** Harvest all trees greater than 1-inch DBH except those marked with green paint.
2. **PINE THINNING AREA:** Harvest all trees marked with orange paint. Harvest white birch, balsam fir, and jack pine containing one or more pulp sticks. Do Not Cut any white birch marked with green paint.
3. **PINE THINNING WITH ASPEN REMOVAL AREA:** Harvest all trees marked with orange paint. Harvest aspen, white birch, balsam fir, and jack pine containing one or more pulp sticks.
4. Harvest area is bounded by red paint lines except where it follows Wilderness Trail, Snipe Lake Fire Lane, and the blue-marked property line. Internal harvest prescription boundaries are marked with purple paint.
5. Harvest shall not take place between April 15th and July 15th to reduce the chance of introducing oak wilt into the sale area or adjacent stands. From July 15th to August 15th, all cut pine products must be removed from the sale area within 14 days of being cut.
6. Minimize damage to residual trees. Leave all dead trees standing unless they pose a hazard to the harvesting operation. Do not damage relic fire scar stumps or trees.
7. Harvest only when ground is sufficiently dry or frozen. Minimize equipment operation on steep slopes.
8. Avoid operating equipment within or adjacent to wetland kegs unless the ground is sufficiently frozen. One small wetland keg lies within the sale area on the north end of the sale along Wilderness Trail; all others lie adjacent to the sale outside the red painted harvest boundaries.
9. Tree length/pole-skidding is prohibited in the Pine Thinning Areas, but may be permissible in the Aspen Coppice Area if the contractor demonstrates the ability to skid without damaging residual trees. If excessive damage occurs, penalties will apply and skidding will be limited to shortwood skidding.
10. Avoid dropping trees into or skidding through concentrated pockets of advanced regeneration within or adjacent to the harvest area.
11. All roads and landings must be cleared and leveled upon sale completion. This area is sufficiently served by existing trails; therefore no new roads are allowed to be constructed. The trail system within the sale area consists of mowed Hunter Hiking Trails – this trail system must be left in equal or better condition following harvest and leveled to a condition that allows for mowing operations.
12. All trees felled across Blue Paint Lines must be pulled back into the sale area before being limbed and topped.
