

Harvest Regulations:

- Red Pine Thinning and Red Pine First Thinning:** Harvest all trees marked with orange paint. Do Not Cut any unmarked Red Pine or White Pine. Leave all dead trees standing unless they create a hazard during forest operations. Do not cut any Oak.
- Aspen Clearcut:** Harvest all merchantable trees except purple-marked leave trees and Oak. All non-merchantable trees having a diameter 1" and greater must be cut concurrent with the harvest of merchantable wood. Green paint line separates clearcut from thinning areas. Do not harvest trees marked with green paint.
- Vilas County Forestry staff will work with the contractor to designate the location of an access trail through the adjacent jack pine plantation that will serve the southern block of red pine thinning. Existing trails serve the remaining harvest area sufficiently. Therefore, Vilas County prohibits the construction of new roads. All roads and landings must be cleared and leveled upon sale completion.
 Hunter Hiking Trails must be left in an equal or better condition that is conducive for mowing post-harvest.
- During the period from May 15 through August 15, the contractor must remove all cut pine products from the sale area within 14 days of cutting.
- The contractor may only use shortwood skidding.
- Avoid damage to residual trees including advanced regeneration. This reduces the risk of spreading disease and degrading future crop trees. Excessive rutting and/or excessive damage to residual trees will cause temporary closure of harvesting operations. Do not damage relic fire scar stumps/trees.
- All trees felled across the Blue Paint Lines must be pulled back into the sale area before being limbed and topped.
- All trees felled into adjacent wetlands must be pulled back into the sale area before being limbed and topped.
- Refer to the Timber Sale Contract for all harvest regulations.
