


Harvest Regulations on Back:

Harvest Regulations:

- 1. Pine Thinning: Harvest all trees marked with orange paint. Do Not Cut any unmarked Red Pine or White Pine. Harvest all merchantable balsam fir having at least one pulp stick. Leave all dead trees standing unless they create a hazard during forest operations. Do Not Cut any Oak.**
- 2. Aspen Clearcut: Harvest all merchantable trees except all oak and birch and trees painted with purple paint. All non-merchantable trees having a diameter 1 " and greater must be cut concurrent with the harvest of merchantable wood. Harvest boundaries with Pine Thinning are marked with a green paint line. Sale harvest boundaries and boundaries with internal wetlands are marked with red paint.**
- 3. Walt's Fire Lane: Harvest all trees marked with orange paint along Walt's Fire Lane south of Aspen Clearcut to its intersection with West Buckatabon Rd.**
- 4. During the period from May 15 through August 15, the contractor must remove all cut pine products from the sale area within 14 days of cutting.**
- 5. Avoid damage to residual trees. This reduces the risk of spreading disease and degrading future crop trees. Excessive rutting and/or excessive damage to residual trees will cause temporary closure of harvesting operations.**
- 6. Tree and pole length skidding will be allowed if the contractor demonstrates the ability to skid without damaging residual trees. If excessive damages occurs penalties will apply and skidding will be limited to shortwood skidding.**
- 7. Existing trails serve this area sufficiently therefore, Vilas County prohibits the construction of new roads. All roads and landings must be cleared and leveled upon sale completion.**
- 8. A state funded snowmobile trail uses Walt's Fire Lane. During the snow season, the contractor must keep snowmobile trails free of logging debris and equipment. When plowing snow must be left on the trail at all times.**
- 9. Refer to the Timber Sale Contract for all harvest regulations.**
